Basically, you'd need to wire the thing in reverse. Instead of two keystone jacks per splitter, you'd either need two ethernet cables going into one keystone jack (which would be good on the router-side), or three keystone jacks (two of them wired into one of them, the one of them being the one connected to your existing ethernet cable, the other two having new cables plugged into the two devices.)
