This has massive ramifications for Microsoft as Longhorn (the next version of Windows) is much more feature-rich than XP. For example, it has a much stronger and more advanced firewall, it has built-in virus protection (MS bought an anti-virus company to do this) and a whole bunch of other stuff. This would all be disallowed by the EU if the judgement is held...

This is really pathetic as frankly it also comes down to which is a better product. I much prefer WMP over RealPlayer and QuickTime. IMO RealPlayer is simply a mess - the whole thing is so clunky in comparison with WMP, it plays less types of media files, and is overall less straightforward, not to mention the whole thing with file usage info being sent to RealNetworks. At least WMP doesn't invade your privacy nearly as much as Real. As for QuickTime - yeah it's ok - but I only use it to play MOV's as WMP is more flexible file-wise and I just prefer its whole setup....
