Currently, I can get by a full day on about 4 hours of sleep. Pretty crazy, eh? I don't do that very often, because it's quite bad for the body. I'd go for about 5-6 hours a night, tops. Some might say the yelling, screaming, and PT is bad... But if you are physically fit beyond the extent of high school athletes, chances are, you'll do fine.
